

MINUTES OF THE WYNNE CITY COUNCIL  
September 13, 2022

The Wynne City Council met at Wynne City Hall on September 13, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. with Mayor JENNIFER HOBBS presiding. The roll was called, and the following councilpersons answered to their names: LESTER MILLER, CHARLES HAMRICK, LISA CARTER, MIKE HAMRICK, BUCK MORRIS, BILLY FOWLER, JOSHUA WYATT, KENNETH LOFTON, CHARLES HOGANS, and JASON NICHOLS; a quorum was declared. City Clerk, Kevin A. Watts, was present. City Attorney, Kathleen Talbott, was present.

On the motion of Councilperson Lofton and seconded by Councilperson Morris and by consent of all Members present, the minutes of a regular council meeting held on August 9, 2022 were approved, accepted, and filed as prepared by the City Clerk.

Dale Williams, Public Works, Blake Marotti, Wynne Water, Lynn Blake, Wynne Fire Department, Daniel Getchell, Wynne Police Department, Zach Morris, Parks & Recreation, and Jennifer Hobbs, Mayor all provided monthly reports. On the motion of Councilperson Morris and seconded by Councilperson Nichols, and by consent of all members present, the department reports presented were approved and accepted.

For the First item of business, Mayor Hobbs presented and read in its entirety Ordinance No. 880 “AN ORDINANCE WAIVING THE BID PROCESS AND LEASE THROUGH ARVEST BANK ONE NEW FREIGHTLINER KNUCKLEBOOM LOADER AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.” After further discussion, Councilperson M. Hamrick with a second from Councilperson Morris made a motion to suspend the rule requiring an ordinance be read on the three different days. The following vote carried the motion:

Councilperson Nichols with a second from Councilperson C. Hamrick made a motion for the emergency clause. The following vote carried the motion:



For the Second item of business, Mayor Hobbs moved to authorize spending by the Fire Department to purchase and install security cameras at the fire station in the amount of \$4,838.00 + tax, purchase floor cleaning equipment in the amount of \$2,530.45, and purchase a refrigerator in the amount of \$3,117.39. After further discussion, on the motion of Councilperson Morris and seconded by Councilperson Wyatt, and by consent of all members present, said spending was approved.


For the Third item of business, Mayor Hobbs moved to authorize spending by the Police Department to purchase "Tip 411", an anonymous reporting app, at the price of \$5,400 for the first two years. After further discussion, on a motion of Councilperson M. Hamrick and seconded by Councilperson Morris, and by consent of all members present, the spending was approved.

For the Fourth item of business, Mayor Hobbs moved to authorize bidding out and selling Public Works' used fuel tanks. After further discussion, Councilperson C. Hamrick with a second from Councilperson Miller, and by consent of all members present the motion to authorize bidding out and selling Public Works' used fuel tanks was approved.

With no further business before council and upon motion and second, the meeting adjourned.
